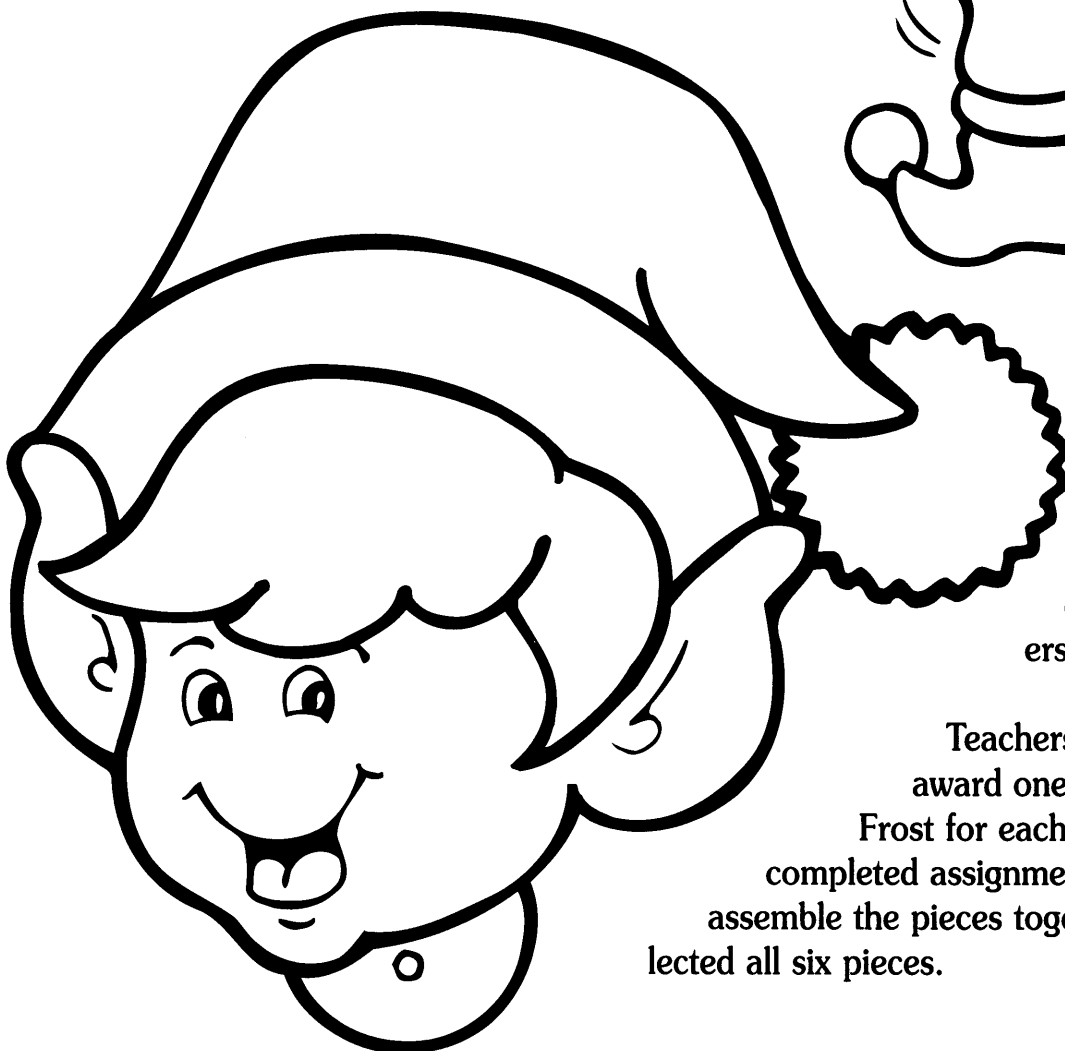
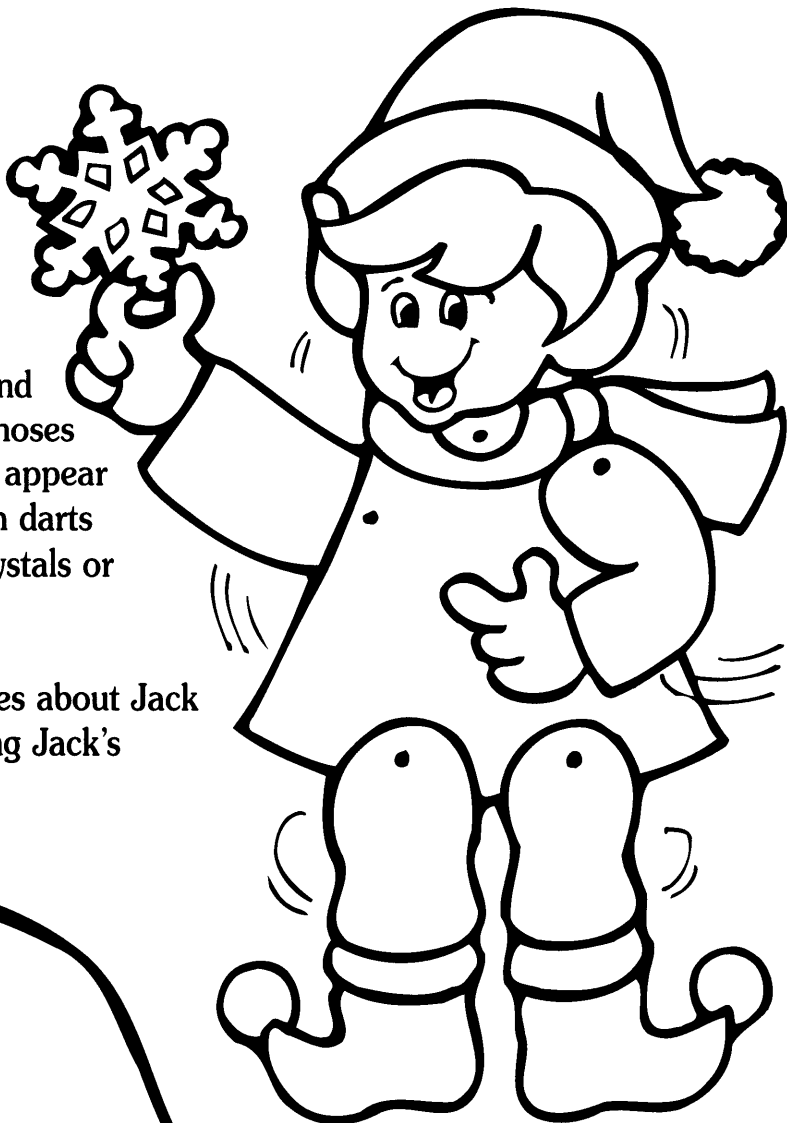


# Jack Frost!

Children might like to write creative stories about Jack Frost, or descriptive poems after observing Jack's beautiful icy creations.



Cut this Jack Frost from colored paper. Color with markers or crayons. Use brass fasteners to assemble at the dots.

Teachers: You might like to award one pattern piece of Jack Frost for each act of good behavior or completed assignment. Children can then assemble the pieces together when they have collected all six pieces.
