



Tell Your Phone Number (or Address)

If you wish, complete the activity on page 34 prior to this activity. Record each child's phone number (or address) by following these steps: Take one child at a time to a quiet room, record the child saying their phone number (or address) into a tape recorder. Give each child an opportunity to have his or her voice recorded onto the tape. When every child has had a turn, the teacher gathers the group together for circle time. The teacher tells the children that they will be listening to the tape and guessing who is talking. They will have to listen carefully to hear themselves and their friends on the tape. Listen to the tape and ask the children who is talking.



Fire Can Be Helpful and Harmful

Copy the fire symbol below and write a word or phrase that shows how fire can be either helpful or harmful on each symbol (one phrase per symbol). Spread the symbols on the floor and have each child select a symbol by tossing a bean bag on the symbol. The child picks up the symbol and the group discusses why it can be either helpful or harmful. Use the examples below.

Helpful: for cooking, for warmth, birthday candles, for light, grills

Harmful: destroys forests, destroys animal homes, destroys people homes, hurts/burns people

Both: fireworks, campfires, matches/lighters
