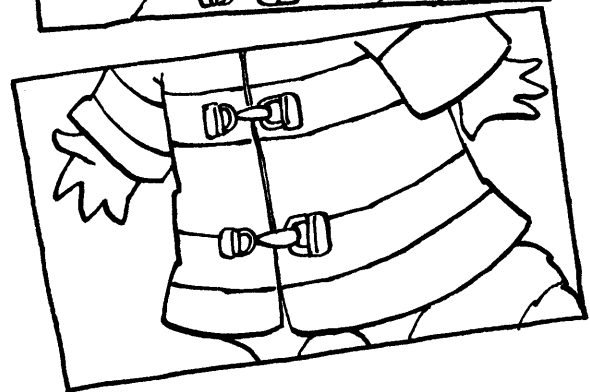
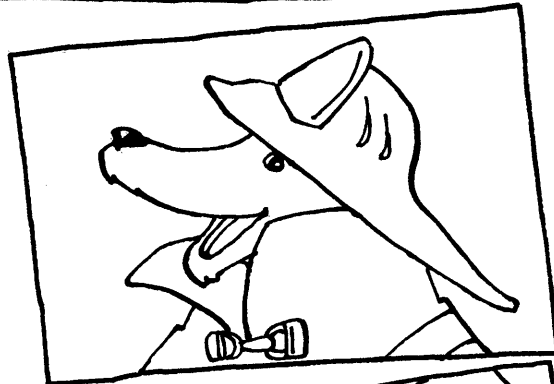
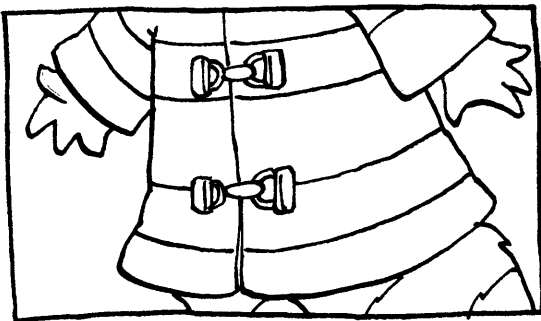
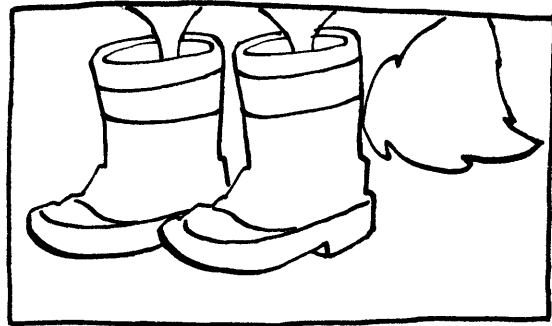
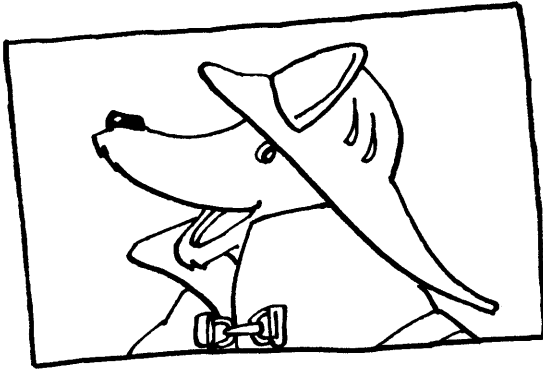


**Who's Body?**

Write safety phrases or words on the helmet (one phrase or word per pattern). Each child can take a turn selecting a helmet. The teacher can then teach the meaning of the rule or word.





### Fred the Fire Fighter (Fox)

Use this cute character to teach important fire safety rules and vocabulary. A puppet can be made from the pattern. Make several copies of the fire engine pattern on the next page. Write safety phrases or words on the fire engine (one phrase or word per pattern). Each child can take a turn selecting a fire engine. The teacher can then teach the meaning of the rule or word.





### Leo the Life Guard (Lion)

Use this cute character to teach important water safety rules and vocabulary. A puppet can be made from the pattern. Make several copies of the life preserver pattern on the next page. Write safety phrases or words on the preservers (one phrase or word per pattern). Each child can take a turn selecting a life preserver. The teacher can then teach the meaning of the rule or word.
